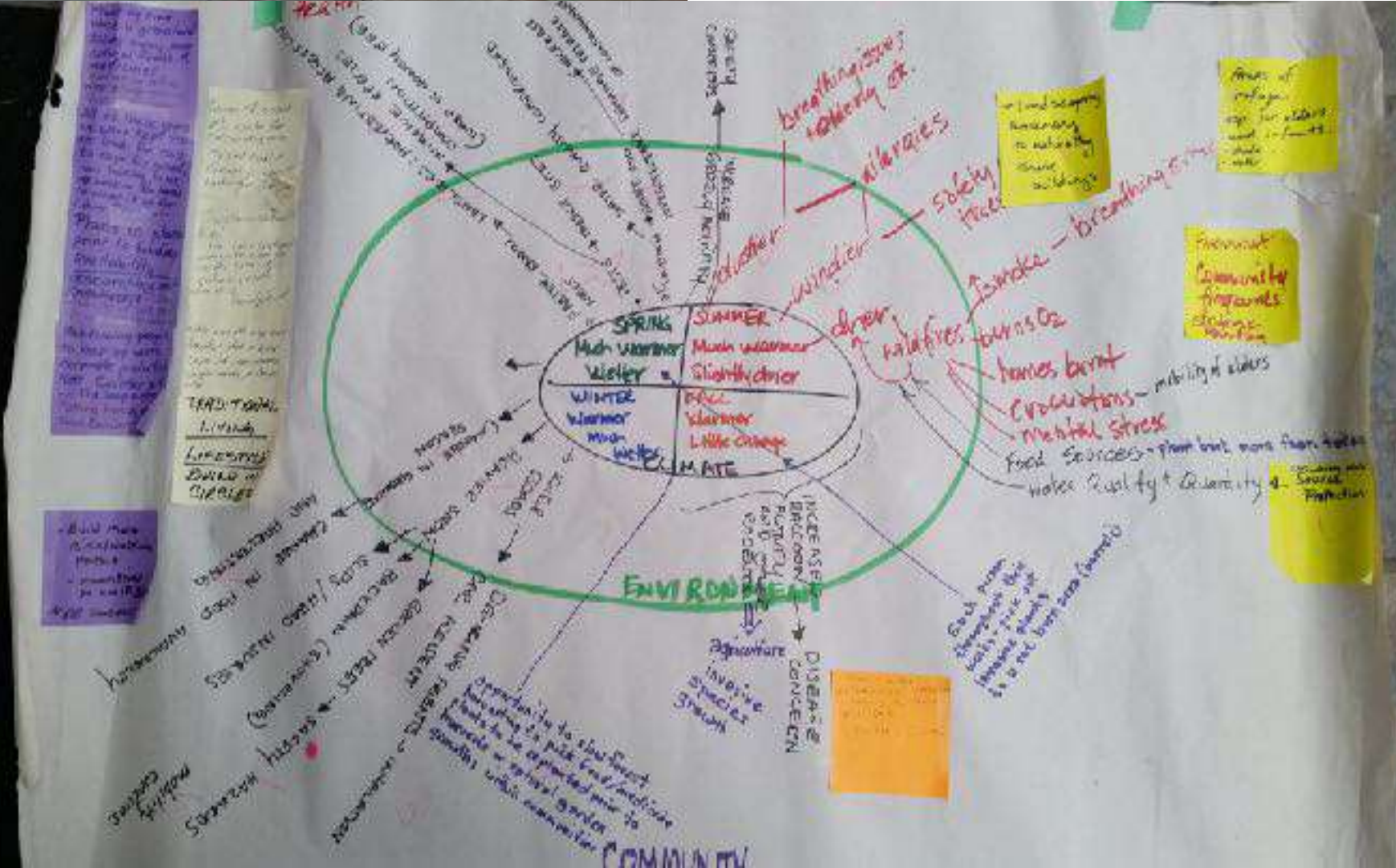

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Ways We Can Adapt

EXAMPLES

Plans

Health - Heat wave support plan
Infrastructure - Housing location/design, water supply
Community - Wildfire protection, emergency preparedness
Conservation - Wildfire management, fisheries restoration
Forestry - Harvest scheduling; harvest season

Day to Day

Health/Infrastructure - Tick searches, water restrictions
Community - Household emergency kit, FireSmart homes
Conservation - Wildfire fuel management, streamside vegetation planting
Forestry - Culvert size, reforestation species

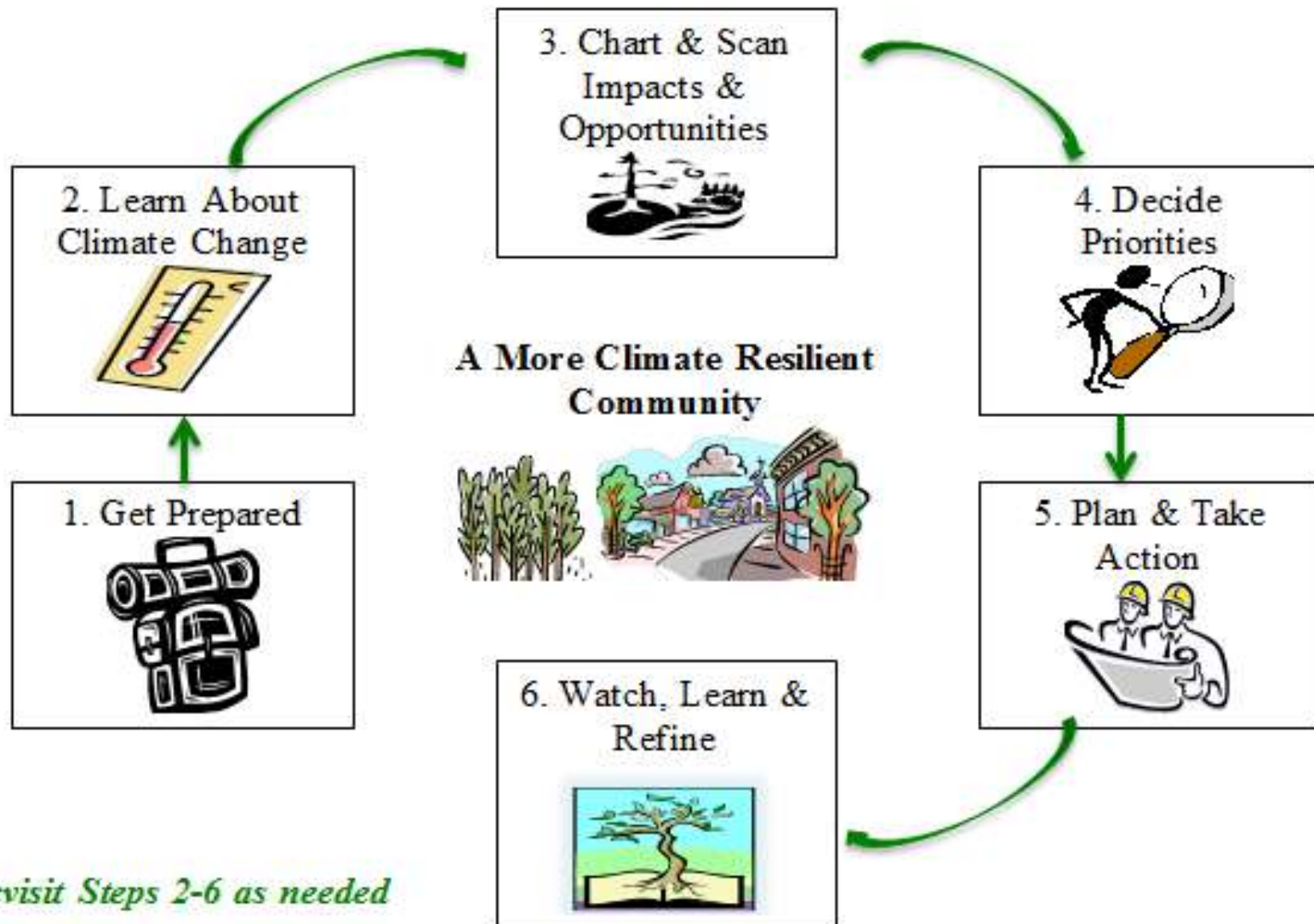
Monitor
